

Things to remember in Nursery

- As we'll be having more sunny days this term, it's a good idea to apply sun cream on your child before school. You can also bring in a bottle of sun cream with your child's name on which the children can apply for the afternoon. It's a good idea to have a sun hat too. In warmer weather, it's really important that the children have a bottle of water every day too.
- Uniform items can get lost, especially jumpers when the children take them off in hot weather! Please make sure that names are written in all clothes. Children struggle with shoe laces. Please try to send your child to school in shoes that don't have laces. Please encourage your child to develop their self help skills at home e.g. fastening their coats. It will really help us in school when we are getting ready for outdoor play.
- Class dojo is a great way to see what we are doing at Nursery. You are also able to message Mrs Gill, Miss Quinn, Miss Gregory or Miss Austen via Dojo on school days. They will try to reply as soon as they can within school hours and help as much as they can!
- Thank you to everyone who has provided all-weather clothing bags and wellies for their children. We still might have some April showers! If you haven't yet then we will be happy to show you what your child will need.
- Please remember that when we are sending your child out at the end of the day, it is a busy time where staff need to ensure each child is handed over to their parent/carer safely. If your child has left something in the class and it is urgent they get it before leaving, please wait until we have let the rest of the children go before sending your child back in. Thank you.

Learning in Nursery :

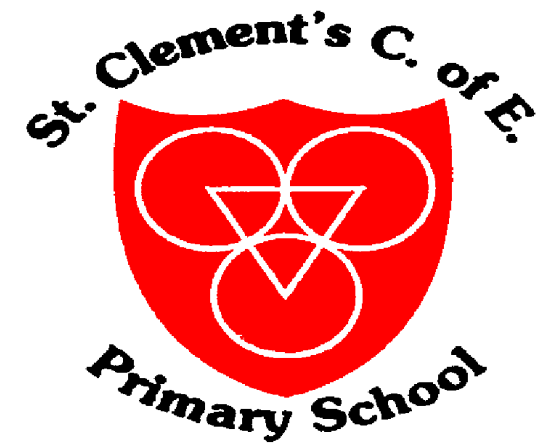
In Nursery this term we will be:

- Learning through topic work based around transport and vehicles with stories such as 'Mr Gumpy's Motor Car' by John Burningham and 'How to Lose a Lemur' by Frann Preston-Gannon
- We will continue to learn how to recognise and write our names, encouraging children to use the correct pencil grip. The children made good progress with this last half term, so thank you for your support in this! To support further, we will continue to develop the physical skills needed for early writing through lots of malleable activities such as painting, creative activities, playdough, dough disco and mark-making.
- This half term in maths we will be learning about sequencing, positional language, more than and less than and shape. We will continue to practise our careful counting skills that we have been learning throughout our daily routine.
- Continuing to develop our sharing and turn taking skills and developing our awareness that some actions and words can hurt others feelings. Learning to listen to others, taking turns to speak, understanding and responding to a range of simple instructions and questions.
- Continuing with Phase 1 Letters and Sounds Phonics. In particular, we will continue to learn about rhyming, alliteration and blending and segmenting sounds.

In nursery we are kind, gentle and supportive friends. We congratulate everyone when they have done something well. We always try our best even if something is difficult.
